

December 2021 - January 2022 Correspondence Report

- a) DAPTC E-News 19th November 2021. NALC, SLCC and One Voice Wales have joined all of the 40+ county associations to try and improve standards across the parish and town council tier.
- b) Latest news from Dorset Council, Friday 19th November. Information on how to stay well this winter.
- c) Advance notice of Daytime eastbound closure - A35 Puddletown Bypass Mon 29th Nov. The road will be closed between the Northbrook and Tolpuddle Ball junctions on the eastbound side only (towards Bere Regis). The westbound carriageway towards Dorchester will not be affected.
- d) Purbeck Local Plan Further Proposed Main Modifications Consultation. They are consulting on limited Further Proposed Main Modifications around Policy V2 and I5, which are considered to be necessary to ensure that the plan is sound. Responses should be submitted by 11:45pm on 24th January 2022.
- e) #LetsTalkLibraries. The consultation will be a conversation with communities, employees and partners, to better understand what they value and need from the service, now and in the future. Closes 7th January.
- f) Annual Residents' Survey 2021. The residents' survey is important to help Dorset Council understand residents' priorities and experiences and will help them make improvements to council services. Closes 14th January.
- g) Public Space Protection Orders (PSPOs) Consultation. A PSPO allows councils to impose restrictions on the use of specific areas. They intend to help ensure that the public can use and enjoy public spaces, safe from anti-social behaviour. The proposals include six PSPOs which are set at town level and the remaining two PSPOs outline new restrictions on camping on beaches and measures to help prevent wildfires. This would prohibit the lighting of fires and other actions which could cause wildfire in specific areas. Closes 13th January.
- h) Household Support fund briefing. Dorset Council's programme of support for residents in need of financial help this winter is now up and running. Communication activities to support take up of various elements will begin on 7 December 2021.
- i) 2022/23 Precept Request. The Tax Base for East Lulworth has decreased by 1.6%.
- j) DAPTC E-News 10th December 2021. The temporary legislation for holding council meetings virtually has not been revisited and NALC is waiting for more guidance.
- k) Citizens Advice Grant Request from Citizens Advice East Dorset & Purbeck
- l) Stakeholder briefing - Vaccination programme. Dorset Health and Care system are working to offer the vaccination to everyone who is eligible for 31st December.
- m) News release: Purbeck collection disruption draft. Various actions are being undertaken to improve the service including increasing pay rates and assistance from the Crookhill team.
- n) Road salting and slat bins briefing note. The webpage shows when routes were last salted and when the next runs are planned Road gritting and salting in Dorset
- o) Decision Making - Joint Update from DAPTC and Dorset Council for Parish and Town Council Meetings in January '22. If your council remain happy to meet face to face and can do so safely, this note is for information only.
- p) Confirm Report: Road works report - Purbeck. No roadworks are due to be carried out in East Lulworth.

- r) January training courses from DAPTC. All these courses will be conducted online.
- s) Latest news from Dorset Council, Friday 7 January. Case rates have continued to rise quickly over the past week across Dorset, and remain higher than at any other point during the pandemic.
